TechBridge is interested in how technology enables your idea.

Nonprofits often brainstorm great ideas but lack the resources to develop them with the latest technology. Georgia Dream Big Technology Grant offers grant recipients funding and experience.

Nonprofits will be applying online for grant dollars beginning February 14. Our staff and judges have created a fairly simple online application that should only take about 25 minutes to complete. This is one of the few grant opportunities focus on nonprofits getting and using software technologies (plus IT hours) to help fulfill their missions. Last year several transformational projects were awarded between \$8,000 and \$24,000— and it all starts by completing the online grant application. Deadline is Friday, March 13.

The good news is that TechBridge pays for 80% and becomes your project partner. It is definitely worth 25 minutes to fill-in-the-blanks. You'll find a helpful worksheet to make completing the application extra easy.

This is one of the few grant opportunities available to support utilizing technologies (plus IT hours) to help NPOs fulfill their missions. TechBridge focuses on nonprofits that concentrate on low-opportunity communities, helping clients navigate from survival to stability to success, and thereby break the cycle of multi-generational poverty. In 2018 and 2019, the Dream Big Technology Granting judging panel of primarily Georgia CIOs, CTOs, CDOs and other technology leaders selected nonprofit organizations with the following NTEE Core Codes:

How does the 80/20 Grant work?

The 4x match formula of the grant is 80/20, meaning TechBridge funds 80% of the project and the nonprofit funds 20% through its funders.
